

B: The clutch pedal, the brake pedal and the gas pedal.

pedal (US) = accelerator / throttle

A: What is the clutch pedal for?

B: It helps to change gears smoothly.

A: How many gears are there in a typical car?
B: Five or six gears for driving forward and one for reverse.

A: Which foot do I use to press the clutch, the brake and the gas?
B: Use your right foot to press the brake and gas pedal, and left foot to press the clutch.

B: You use two pedals, the steering wheel, and the gear selector.

B: The brake pedal and the gas pedal.

B: It is used to shift drive modes.

A: How do I indicate a turn to the right in a typical car?

B: Move the signal lever up.

102.

A: How do I indicate a turn to the left?

B: Push the signal lever down.

103.

A: What is a turn signal called?

B: A blinker. When it is on, you can see a light blinking on the dashboard.

A: How can I turn off the blinker?

B: It should turn off automatically when you complete the turn.

A: What if it does not turn off?
B: Move the signal lever to the "off" position.

A: How can I clean the windshield on the move?
B: Use the windshield wiper lever.

A: What is the sun visor for?
B: It protects against sun glare. Lower it if the sun is blinding you.

A: What lights should I have on at night?

B: Turn on the headlights and sidelights.

A: As far as I know, there are two types of headlights. What are they?

B: Low beam and high beam.

A: What is the high beam?

B: It's a far-reaching headlight. Turn it off to avoid blinding oncoming drivers.

A: What is the low beam?

B: It's the light that you use most of the time. It's also called the dipped headlight.

A: What are fog lights for?

B: They help you see road markings in fog.

A: How can I regulate temperature in a car?

B: You can simply lower or raise a car window to let in

114.

A: How do I lower or raise it?

B: If there are power windows, press a button or switch. In older cars, use a crank handle to roll down or roll up a window.

A: What if the temperature outside of a car is the same as inside?

B: Use the climate control system to raise or lower temperature.

A: What is the glove compartment?

B: It is a recess with a flap in the dashboard.

A: What can I keep in the glove

B: Any small items, but don't keep important documents inside it.

A: Why not?

B: It's the first place thieves look in after they break a car window or jimmy a lock.

119.

A: How do I start a car?

B: Sit in the driver's seat and buckle up.

120.

A: That's obvious. How do I start the engine, step by step?

B: It depends on whether you have a manual or automatic transmission.

121.

A: OK, how do I start an automatic transmission car?

B: Insert the key in the ignition. Make sure that your hand brake is engaged and your gear lever is in Park mode. Press the brake

pedal with your right foot, and turn the key clockwise. Release the key as soon as the engine starts.

122.

A: That's easy. How do I start a manual transmission car?

B: Again, insert the key in the ignition. Your hand brake must also be engaged. Press the clutch pedal with your left foot. Turn the key to start the engine. Make sure that the shifter is in the Neutral position, then remove your left foot from the clutch pedal.

A: How can I verify that the shifter is in the Neutral position?

B: Try to move the lever to the left and to the right. If it moves substantially, that's Neutral.

124.

A: Are there any other ways to start a car?

B: Yes. An Engine Start/Stop button is used in some cars instead of the ignition key.

A: Will an automatic car start moving in the Park mode?

B: No, it will not.

126.

A: Can a manual car move if the shifter is in the Neutral position?

B: The engine can't move the car, but the car can roll on an inclined surface if you release the hand brake.

127.

A: How do I start moving an automatic car?

B: Put the gear selector in the Drive mode, and then release the hand brake and the brake pedal. The car will start moving forward slowly. To speed up, press the gas pedal.

128.

A: How do I start moving a manual car?

B: Press the clutch to the floor and move the gearstick into first gear. Lift your left foot up from the clutch pedal and at the same time push down your right foot on the gas pedal. The car will move forward.

129.

A: How do I start moving an electric car?

B: Electric cars don't have a traditional gearshift. Select the driving direction, forward or reverse, and push the accelerator pedal to start moving.

130.

A: How do I drive a car?

B: Keep your hands on the steering wheel and press the gas pedal.

131.

A: Do I have to shift gears while driving?

B: In an automatic or electric car, no. In a manual car, yes.

132.

A: How do I turn left or right?

B: Use the blinker and slow down before turning the steering wheel.

A: How do I stop the car?

B: Release the gas pedal and press the brake. In a manual car, press the clutch at the same time and change the gear.

134.

A: What else do I have to do while driving?

B: Obey traffic lights and traffic signs. Keep a safe distance from other cars. Yield the right of way to pedestrians at crosswalks.

(US) = pedestrian crossing

135.

A: What should I do if I'm running out of gas?

B: Drive to the nearest gas station and refuel the car.

station (US) = petrol station

136.

A: How can I find a gas station?

B: Look for the relevant road sign.

137.

A: What if there are no road signs nearby?

B: Use your car's navigation system or a navigator on your smartphone. Ultimately, use your English language skills to ask a passerby for directions!
